## **Launch of CarePortal in Craig County**

In a significant milestone for the Love Thy Neighbor Fund, we successfully launched CarePortal in Craig County, marking a pivotal moment in our journey to support our community's most vulnerable members.

The launch event highlighted the culmination of three years of dedication and hard work by our founders, C. Jordan Labiosa and McDonald, in partnership with the Craig County Department of Social Services (DSS). Pat Franklin, the DSS Director, expressed excitement about the potential of CarePortal to extend support beyond the department's capabilities, emphasizing the platform's role in enabling the community to aid their neighbors during challenging times.

The enthusiastic participation and support from the community, including churches, school board members, and local volunteers, were overwhelming. Our commitment to covering the first year's expenses for schools to join CarePortal reflects our dedication to ensuring no need goes unmet in Craig County.

This event was not only a celebration of what we have achieved together but also a reaffirmation of our commitment to fostering a supportive, compassionate community. It has set a strong foundation for the Love Thy Neighbor Fund's efforts moving forward, emphasizing the transformative power of community collaboration in making a lasting and positive impact on our county.

## Impact of CarePortal in Craig County

During just the four months that CarePortal was active in Craig County it had already had a tremendous impact on the community. 14 children and 8 adults were served with a total economic impact of \$2006. Examples of actual requests fulfilled:

A single mother with two children who recently left her home due to domestic violence and abuse of the children. Mom and both the kiddos are living with her mother. Her 5 year old son was able to find clothes at the local clothing closet but the 13 year girl was not able to find anything that was age appropriate for her. Our request is to help his young teenage regaining her self image and confidence by allowing her to shop for some school clothes.

Prison Fellowship's Angel Tree Program is partnering with CarePortal to serve the children of incarcerated parents. This request is for four children ages 2, 3, 7 and 9. All three of the older children love art, and all of them love music. The older three like games, and two have Nintendo Switches. The baby girl loves farm stuff, especially cows. Per Angel Tree specifications, gifts should not exceed \$25.


Craig County DSS is looking for a female "mentor" to assist one of our 18 year old females with Independent Living Skills to ensure that the youth is as prepared as she can be for when she ages out of our Fostering Futures Program. The individual we are seeking must be able to pass a CPS and Virginia State Background Check (any fees will for checks will be covered by DSS) prior to being considered for this position. This position is critical for our youth and the individual will be reviewed by the youth's caseworker and DSS Director/Supervisor.

This family resides in Craig County and is a foster home for a different locality. They are currently waiting on a substance exposed infant to be released from the NICU to come to their home as a foster placement. The family has children of their own and do not have an additional dresser or storage for the infants room.

We have a single father, who recently moved to Craig County with hardly any furniture for his children. The family is in need of a dresser and a bunk bed and one twin mattress. The family has one full mattress. Meeting this need will allow the children to have a bed to sleep in and somewhere they can put their clothes. Updated on October 13, 2023 by an Agency Worker change from twin/twin bunkbed to twin/full size bunkbed.
